


HSH became a United Way-supported agency in 2024 with the receipt of a three-year Feed Grant for HSH's Homeward Bound Halton program.

WORLD DOWN SYNDROME DAY

March 21 is recognized worldwide as **World Down Syndrome Day**, a day to raise awareness and celebrate the uniqueness of Individuals with Down Syndrome.

Catherine Villasenor, HSH's Director of Operations, along with her husband, family, friends, and HSH, celebrated her son, Caidan who was born with Down Syndrome and is quickly approaching the 'three-nager age, sharing his smile and tenacity for life.

Catherine has openly shared her experiences of raising a child with Down Syndrome, often crediting her community made up of those in her personal circle, work, medical practitioners and therapists, daycare educators, and Down Syndrome advocates for helping with providing Caidan with the support he needs to thrive. She knows raising a child is not meant to be a one- or two-person job and should include the community. And building a world that not only celebrates Caidan's abilities and differences, but also includes and accepts him for all that he is, must include everyone.

"Many things do not come easily to Caidan, and so when he's completing everyday tasks, he may be slower or need a little extra help. But if given the opportunity and space to practice, he has the potential to eventually do things on his own and learn new skills. But I need people to believe that and believe in him. If people continue to live with the assumption that he has no ability and never give him the opportunity to learn like any other kid, then he won't ever get the chance to reach his full potential – he needs opportunity, just like you or me!

I've seen the power of what a community coming together can accomplish. And a lot of these conversations start at home with our children. While World Down Syndrome Day has passed, there is always time for us to take action and invest in building a world of inclusion and supporting your neighbour."

FUN FACTS ABOUT DOWN SYNDROME



- •Down Syndrome is a genetic condition caused by an extra copy of chromosome 21, resulting in 47 chromosomes instead of the usual 46
- •March 21 (3/21) was the chosen date of World Down Syndrome Day, to signify that chromosome 21 has 3 copies instead of 2 for individuals with Down Syndrome
- •Chromosomes look like socks, so on World Down Syndrome Day, people wear mismatched or colourful socks in support of the celebration
- •While it is anticipated that Individuals with Down Syndrome will experience developmental delays, individuals with Down Syndrome have a wide range of abilities, talents and many lead fulfilling and independent lives

321 ROCK YOUR MISMATCHED SOCKS

The Villasenor family took part in the **321 Rock Your Mismatched Socks** initiative to raise awareness about Down Syndrome at Caidan's daycare.

FORMER STAFFER'S COUNSELLING SERVICES

HSH's former BSW placement student, Sarah McAlpine, who later was hired as the HSH Life Skills Coordinator, is now the owner and Clinical Director of Lakeview Counselling &



Wellness, which opened full-time in February 2022 and has grown into a multidisciplinary team of 12 with therapists and a nurse practitioner.

With a primary office in Huntsville and others in North Bay and Toronto, Lakeview is a dynamic mental health clinic that offers in-person and telehealth counselling, assessments, and medication prescriptions as needed. It also offers free and low-cost therapy for low income individuals.



Sarah McAlpine

Sarah offers in-person counselling in Huntsville and virtual counselling Ontario-wide for ages 10 years and up. Sarah is a Registered Social Worker and Ontario Certified Teacher. She holds an Educational Assistant Diploma, an Honours Bachelor of Social Work, and a Bachelor of Education. She is trained in Cognitive Behaviour Therapy, Dialectical Behaviour Therapy, Emotion-Focused Therapy, Play Therapy, Canine-Assisted Therapy, and Crisis Intervention. She has professional experience with special education, neurodivergence, dual diagnoses and many mental health diagnoses like anxiety, depression, mood and personality disorders, ASD, ADHD, ODD, etc.

Sarah supports youths, adults, couples, and families, in a non-judgmental space. Sarah is a 2SLGBTQIA+ affirming-therapist with personal and professional experience within the community.
